	Question from G.Tam regarding what is planned for CIPHI's surplus. This was addressed by President Engele- Carter who explained that CIPHI still anticipates more legal and consultant bills related to the completion of polices to deal	





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	with mandatory membership, membership discipline, CoPE audit process revisions. Revisions to Member Service Centre are also on the radar.	
	There is also uncertainty regarding revenue from membership dues as mandatory membership and the professional development hours progressive compliance cycle are implemented. In addition the Annual Educational Conference profits have become unpredictable. As these issue stabilize CIPHI will be in a better position to commit to longer term expenditures. In the meantime the surplus is not of the magnitude that it jeopardizes CIPHI's Not for Profit Corporation status.	
	A question as raised by Keir Cordner as to whether CIPHI should be looking into whether their current liability insurance would cover the corporation's expenses in the event of a legal challenge. This matter will be explored by the NEC with our insurance provider and members will be provided with a response.
